Purpose of a Baby Monitor

Types of Baby Monitors

There are several types of baby monitors, each suited for different needs:

Audio monitor: Lets you hear your baby from another room.

Video monitor: Provides live video from your baby's room to a phone or tablet.

App-based monitor: Turns your phone or tablet into a monitoring device, either audio or video.

Movement monitor: Sends an alarm if the baby doesn't move for a certain period.

Heart and breathing monitor: Tracks vital signs with electrodes on your baby's chest, raising alarms for irregularities.

Oxygen measurement monitors and oximeters: Alert caregivers when oxygen levels drop below a certain threshold.

Monitors for hearing impaired carers: Use lights or vibrations to alert caregivers that their baby is awake.
