Sensitive detergent for baby clothes.
A nappy bag for carrying essentials when out and about.

Postpartum Essentials for Parents

Comfortable underwear as your body recovers.
Nipple cream for soothing tenderness.
A large water bottle to stay hydrated, especially if breastfeeding.
